Parental talk at Birchwood High School

We would like to invite you to a presentation from Birchwood High School at 3.15pm on Friday 3rd May about how to keep your children safe on mobile phones.

There are some really useful apps that we can offer at no initial charge that allow your child to have a phone, but will alert you if there is any dangerous language or behaviour - either from your child or from incoming data. Please see below links for more information and a letter from Ms Mills.

We hope that as many of you can attend as possible as this is a unique opportunity to ensure that our children stay as safe as possible in the modern technological world.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Disconnect to Reconnect: The future in our children's hands which is phones shouldn't be.

As the headteacher of Birchwood Community High School, I am writing to you about something that I am very passionate about: the safety and well-being of our children in the digital age. With the prevalence of smartphones and social media, our children are increasingly exposed to various risks such as online predators, inappropriate content, and excessive screen time. I have watched this unfold over the last 22 years in education and the impact it is having on a generation of children is significant. We know that there is a mental health crisis nationally for young people; in part this is due to the pandemic but I firmly believe that big contributors to this is are also smartphones and social media.

I am reaching out to you as we would like to offer you support and guidance before you purchase that first phone (or support if they already have one). So many parents believe their child 'has' to have a smartphone ready for secondary school whereas we spend so much of our time taking the phones away. So, as part of the One Community Trust, we are embarking on a campaign - Disconnect to Reconnect, aimed at raising awareness about the dangers associated with smartphones and social media. We are offering you an invitation to a presentation that will highlight the risks of online predators, the accessibility of inappropriate or harmful content, and the negative impacts of excessive screen time on our children's well-being and development. Essentially though, we will introduce potential solutions to tackle these issues and offer you support, including the Parent Shield network and the Ontaro app. These resources offer tools and support to help parents monitor and manage their children's online activities, ensuring a safer and healthier digital environment for our families. The vast majority of issues that occur due to phones/social media happens outside of school time which is why we want to work together with you to support the young people in our Trust and in Warrington focusing on the importance of safeguarding our children's future by promoting responsible and balanced technology use.

We would love for you to attend this presentation, which will take place on May 3rd at 3.20pm in the school hall Your participation and engagement would be appreciated so we can ensure that we are giving our children every chance and every support that they need to have a happy and healthy future.

Thank you for your support, and we look forward to seeing you at the presentation.
