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INTERNET SAFETY

Thank you very much to Detective Superintendent Rawlinson who delivered extremely informative Internet safety talks to a group of parents in school yesterday.

We are going to put additional information on our website to help you to ensure that your child is safe online.

Basic rules are to check all of their devices – make sure that you have a password to access all areas – and look for hidden apps that may be stored in utility areas such as looking like a calculator.

In addition – any App that allows open access, such as a multiplayer mode, can expose your child to strangers. Predators online target children's games and may well pretend to be a child the same age.

The NSPCC website has a 'Share Aware' campaign which rates how safe the sites, apps and games your child uses.

Mylol and Yellow are new dating sites that are targeting teenagers and promote meeting up with strangers. The Police say that there are many younger children and adults also on these websites. Please be aware of the dangers.
