
Please find below the School Dinner Menu for the Autumn Term 2025. It is vital that you book your child's school meal a week in advance, using the school booking system.

One of our captains has enjoyed learning a Farmer's Jig dance in PE.


The other has enjoyed learning about tens and ones in Maths.


