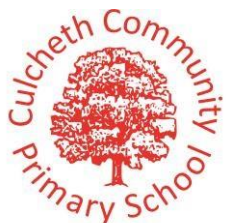

School Improvement plan 2019/2020

Here are some of the things that we did last year to improve our school:

- We won a National Lottery bid to build a new Astroturf area in the Junior playground
- We bought a new Maths scheme 'Power Maths' to start in the Infant classes and work through school to improve attainment and progress in Maths.
- We improves attendance across school to above national average levels.
- We ran a successful mental health programme called the 'Happiness Project' across school to help children to manage their emotions and worries.
- We developed language across the school, including changing our reading schemes to ensure that children read a wide range of genres and are secure at a reading level before moving onto the next level.
