# Activities in Warrington during the Summer

## Children's Zoo - Walton Hall and Gardens

Our zoo is free to enter, and we have an array of animals ready to give you a warm welcome. There are our three alpaca musketeers Jim, Mally and Topaz and Lenny and Charlie our jovial [rescue donkeys](#). We're also home to rabbits, potbellied pigs, Herdwick sheep, African pygmy goats, guinea pigs and a colourful, eclectic mix of birds, including our notoriously, noisy peacocks. You're also likely to catch a glimpse of our native Red Squirrels playing inside purpose-built runs and cages. Our little Children's Zoo plays a big role as part of a nationwide breeding programme for our native reds, and we're proud to provide them with a home.

Open in all weathers come rain or shine (and the occasional snow), our friendly animals are always happy to welcome you to our Children's Zoo.

## **GIRLS ROAR**

This an ongoing group project delivered from The Hub (formerly known as Orford Youth Base), Capesthorne Road, Warrington, WA2 0JF on Thursdays from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. The aim of the GIRLS ROAR is to empower young women to be able to make safer decisions for themselves, to be ambitious about their futures and to challenge injustices and inequalities they face in society as young females.

The research shows that young women thrive in female-only spaces. GIRLS ROAR will create opportunities for young women to recognise their power to successfully navigate social situations and to understand the push and pull factors driving their behaviour.

GIRLS ROAR is a project for young females of high school age. Referrals are not necessary but if you believe that a young woman you are currently working with would benefit from accessing the project, please contact me to discuss their needs, so that it can be decided if a Best Support Consultation would be beneficial to make staff aware of your young person's needs.

Each session will have a theme based on a contextual safeguarding concern delivered in a chill and chat part of the session. Other activities on offer include: arts and crafts activity, cooking/baking, table top activities (questionnaires, worksheets, screening tools).

### **Parks and Open spaces**

Visit one of our many parks and open spaces from the famous and historic Walton Hall and Gardens to the magnificent Trans Pennine Trail. We also have a range of recreation grounds where you can book a football pitch or bowling green.

A variety of engaging activities are available for school-aged children (ages 4–16), including dance, multi-sports, skating, arts, and enrichment days.

Additional programmes tailored specifically for older children will be added soon.

Eligible children can book up to 16 sessions throughout the summer holidays. Please remember that the HAF programme is primarily for children who receive benefit-related free school meals. However, a limited number of places are available for families supported by professionals who would significantly benefit from attending. These will be allocated on a case-by-case basis.
