Attendance since 3rd September = 95.99%



Behaviour curriculum

This week we have been trialling our new Behaviour Curriculum. Last half term we focussed on our positive reinforcement with the implementation of our Dojo Shop. This half term we have introduced our new behaviour steps to enable the children to reflect on misbehaviour and to move forward in a positive way.



Step 1 – Great Choices!

You get smiles, kind words, dojo points and messages home!



Step 2 – Gentle Reminder

A look, a signal or a whisper to remind you of our rules. Praise when you make a better choice!



Step 3 – Warning

A clear warning if you forget after a reminder.



Step 4 - Time Out

Sit at the reflection table for 5 minutes. Think about how to make things better. Teacher and grown-ups are told.



Step 5 - Friendly Neighboring

Spend 10 minutes in another class to reset. Kind chat about what happened. Parents may be asked to come and talk.

Step 6 – Key Stage Leader

Key Stage Leader will talk with you and your teacher. Parents meet with us to make a plan.



Step 7 – Headteacher

The Headteacher helps sort things out and decide next steps.




