**YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK = 2<sup>ND</sup> JUNE - 12<sup>TH</sup> JUNE**

During June, our Y4 children will take part in the national Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). This is a short online check set by the government to help ensure children have a secure understanding of their times tables. The check is completed online using a tablet. It asks children up to 25 multiplication questions and gives children 6 seconds to answer each question. You can help your child at home by practising little and often, using quick-fire questions while travelling or at home, encouraging children to use Times Tables Rock Stars or other games/apps and focusing on rapid recall rather than written methods. Please continue to reassure your child that this is nothing to worry about.

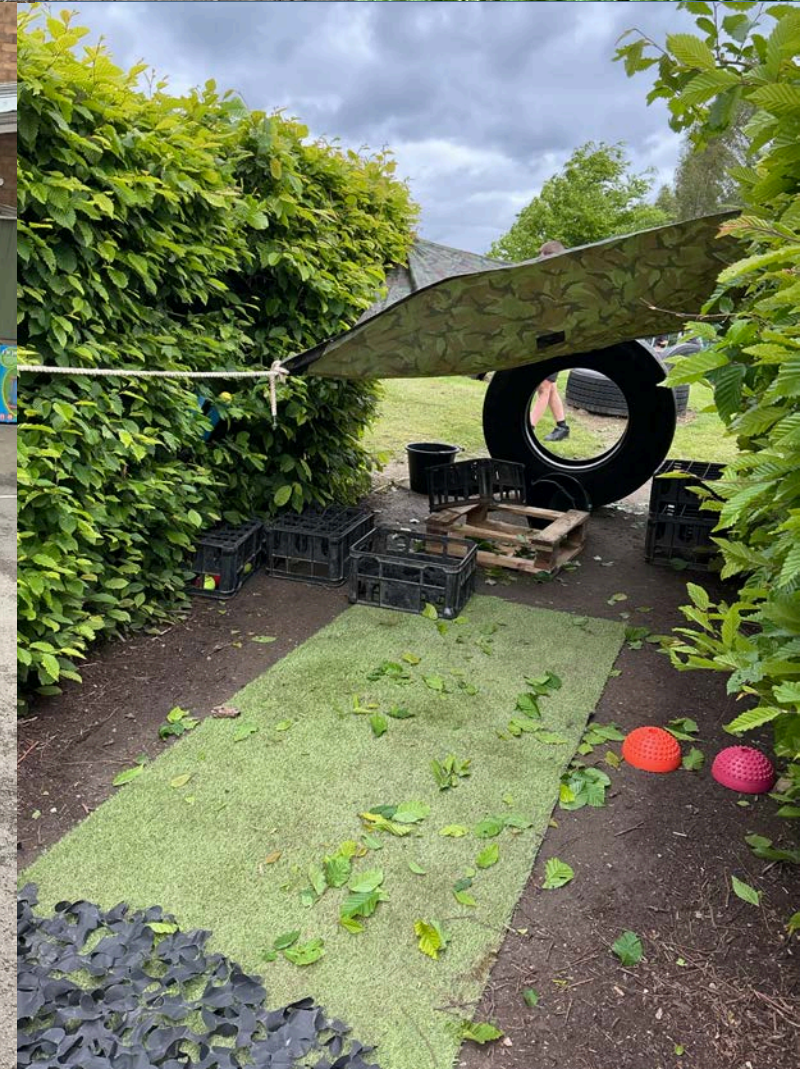

# BBC SERIES

We have been contacted by a casting team at Five Mile Films in Bristol following the filming that took place in Year 1 this week, regarding a warm new BBC series called **Will You Be My Friend?**, about childhood friendships. They are now specifically looking for a group of children to take part in the series.

The series follows children aged 5 to 8 who may be finding friendships difficult - whether that's due to shyness, feeling overwhelmed around other children, or struggling in social situations. Across three half-days during the summer holidays, child psychologists help each child build confidence and social skills, before they are sensitively matched on a playdate with a potential new friend from their local area. Filming will take place during July and August 2026.

Alongside this main casting process, we are currently looking for sociable, confident children aged 5 to 8 who enjoy meeting new people and making friends, and who may be open to taking part in a filmed playdate with one of the children featured in the series.
